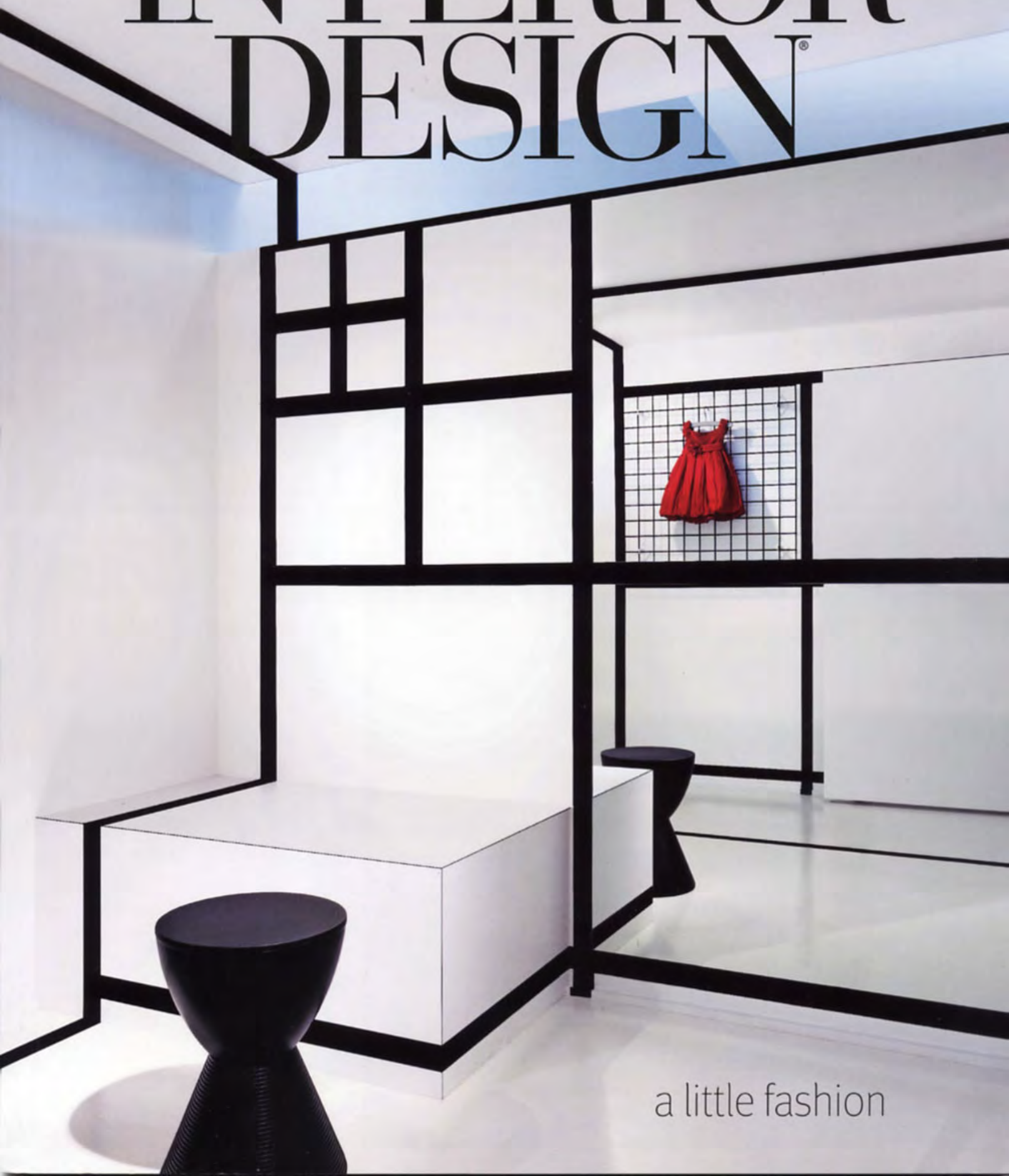

The Future's So Bright. . .

Summer's strong rays are imminent, and architects are getting out their sunglasses. Jürgen Mayer H. is, in fact, designing them—his five frames for Ic! Berlin are as asymmetrical as his avant-garde buildings. Royal College of Art architecture professor Nigel Coates's tongue-in-cheek Aviator mirrors, which look like mirrored aviators, made their limited-edition debut as part of the recent "Barrocabilly" at the Cristina Grajales



Gallery in New York. And the city's latest Oliver Peoples boutique is the work of Commune, a Los Angeles firm that clearly knows a thing or two about sunshine.

Artists are getting in on the action, too. In "Reconfiguring the African Icon: Odes to the Mask by Modern and Contemporary Artists From Three Continents," on view at New York's Metropolitan Museum of Art through August 21, Romuald Hazoumè's sculpture wears "shades" made from salvaged headphones.
